Dear Friends of the Ethiopian Education Fund,

Thank you once again for your support of EEF. We are making a difference in the lives of each and every student...and the lives of their family.

COVID19 has affected Ethiopia just like the United States and other countries. Schools and businesses have closed, government workers are working from home, and social distancing policies have been enacted. All students, including EEF-supported students, are spending time at home helping with chores and hopefully studying.

Support from EEF helps these students and their families get through this time of hardship. Just like in the US, the Ethiopian economy is expected to enter a recession and small businesses and shops are struggling. Your support enables families to stay healthy and students to return to

their education once the threat of COVID19 ends. And it is appreciated. One university student recently emailed the EEF Board to ask about our own health: "I want to know your health condition. God bless you all; we are praying for the whole world."

On other fronts, EEF has been able to expand its support to children in need through a local government program that helps destitute children and families in extreme poverty. Our partnership with the local community has helped us engage the Women & Children's Affairs Dept and learn of the good work they are doing. For two years in a row we have given them grants to support their program helping children in need throughout the area. This is an existing program that EEF supports by providing "budgetary supplement" to their program. We were very impressed with their program and the fact that members of the department had been contributing their own personal funds. The program provides books, pens, school clothing and even food to enable children in grades 1-4 attend school.


Given the success of this program, we expanded to the nearby larger town of Bonga for the same purpose: reach the most at-risk kids possible through an existing program. Tsegaye, a former EEF student who graduated in Social Work and now is a member of the Bonga office, encouraged us to provide support. Your donations have enabled children on the edge of survival to receive uniforms, supplies, and attend school.



## **COVID19** and Ethiopia

As of 6 May, Ethiopia had few cases of COVID19 (162) and very few deaths (4). The Ethiopian Government took early and swift action to close schools, colleges, and universities; promote social distancing; restrict entry to the country by foreigners; and require non-essential government employees to work from home. However,

we are concerned because the Ethiopian culture is built on regularly visiting your relatives, frequently buying food and supplies from small shops, and generally hanging out with one's friends. All of this

means lots of interactions between lots of people.

For Ethiopia, our concern is not about access to ventilators; it is about access to basic care needed to fight infections. By basic, we mean clean water, hand soap, good nutrition, treatment for chronic diseases, and for the most severe cases access to supplemental oxygen. It is about access to healthcare, which may require walking great distances to the clinic. It is about farmers who need to remain healthy so they can prepare their fields for the planting season that arrives in June

in order to ensure the country has enough food in the fall. We hope the Government acted quickly enough to contain this potentially devastating disease.
