Student update - April 2014

We now support a range of students, ages 7 to 27, from first grade to graduate school. In a country whose adult literacy rate is 40% and only 15% of youth reach secondary school, each one of our students is important and it is especially gratifying to have students in university and professional schools.

Let me tell you about some of our students. Assegedech is number one in her 10th grade class, her teachers are very proud of her English which is incredibly important since all classes after 7th grade are taught in English. Another student is Asayech. She finished 10th grade last year but was unable to pass the extremely difficult national leaving exam, which would have allowed her to continue her education to university or to nursing or teaching colleges. Not content to stop learning, she took it upon herself to find an opening at the Technical College in another town where she was able to enroll in a program that allows her to continue her education studying electrical engines for the rapidly growing Ethiopian manufacturing industry. Our youngest student Tsion is

At EEF, we celebrate each additional year a student attends school. Studies show that each

additional year a child goes to school will delay the age of marriage, increase resistance to domestic violence and female circumcision, and increase a woman's income. Truly every year counts toward improved health, economic benefit, and family well-being. While we want all students to attend university, we recognize that not all will. But success is measured by a smart child from a poor family going to school for just one more year. And as long as students keep passing their grades, EEF will keep supporting them.

With this in mind, consider that \$30 will support a young girl for a month as she reaches for a better life; \$150/month will support a student in college.
